Hi Mark -

With the help of the VNC we actually just placed another 50 or so new cans in Venice across strategic locations they picked a few months ago - this is after a few years of additional rounds of can deployment and apart of the Mayor's 5,000 new cans initiative. The new cans were added all over Venice including at Windward & Main! I will make sure to focus my attention and that of the neighborhood committee I jointly worked with to around the post office when advising LASAN during their next deployment of cans. As an aside, Business Improvement Districts can only legally service the territory in which is assessed, so, while they are their own organization which can tell you themselves, I do know that it isn't something they would be able to provide.

Taylor,

How difficult would it be to get the Bureau of Sanitation to permanently place four trash bins around the Post Office property, two at the western end and one each on the corner of Grand and Riviera and the corner of Riviera and Windward? And to empty them once a week?

As I walk to and from the Post Office, the Bank of America, and the Boardwalk I frequently see trash in the planter boxes or deposited next to them or on the curb.

This is in part due to the absence of trash bins in convenient locations on these high traffic routes to and from the beach.

At one time there was a trash bin on the corner of Windward and Main, but it is long gone.

Or could the Venice BID maintain trash bins at those locations and service them once a week? Clearly the people who are leaving the trash are here to visit the BID district, not our residences.

We - the residents - have done all the heavy lifting with the beautification effort, with the only real assistance from the City coming from the LAPD. To date we have raised over \$35,000 for this effort and provided countless hours of volunteer labor.

Can the City of Los Angeles at least make an effort to provide trash bins and regularly empty them?
